Background

The National Ecosystem Assessment Initiative's (NEA Initiative) Global Workshop takes place annually to facilitate knowledge exchange, share project updates and lessons learned, and identify key priorities related to the implementation of the assessment process and the use of assessment findings.

The NEA Initiative at UNEP-WCMC is funded by the International Climate Initiative (IKI) of the German Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation, Nuclear Safety and Consumer Protection (BMUV). As part of the NEA Initiative's global capacity-building programme, the workshop is expected to be attended by national ecosystem assessment representatives from Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Botswana, Cambodia, Dominican Republic, Grenada, Malawi, Thailand, alongside other partners and international experts from Cameroon, Colombia, Ethiopia and Viet Nam.

Workshop Objectives

- 1. <u>Identify and facilitate key capacity development support</u> based on countries' priority needs.
- 2. <u>Provide key updates on project progress and lessons learned</u> between and across countries to facilitate knowledge exchange.
- 3. <u>Present key tools to countries developed by UNEP-WCMC and partners</u> to support the national ecosystem assessment process, including the use of assessments' outputs and findings.
- 4. Provide feedback for UNEP-WCMC and partners to strengthen their support for current and future partners.
- 5. <u>Facilitate and promote networking opportunities</u> and strengthen global communities of practice around ecosystem assessments.

Key Participants

The workshop will be attended by key representatives nominated by each of the country teams. Participants will include members of the core assessment teams, assessment authors, government representatives from country partners, as well as experts from countries that have already finalized their national ecosystem assessments and who will share their experiences in the implementing phase.
